Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been lovely this week, to see the children still having fun at lunchtimes in the sun. Let's hope that the sun continues to shine for a few more weeks.

#### **Key Stage 2 Cloakrooms**

We have had a few concerns from parents/carers and children about the cloakrooms in KS2. Myself, Colin Wilkinson and Mrs Kirkpatrick this week have been looking at how we can develop the two cloakrooms and turn them into group rooms. We intend to have individual lockers either outside or inside the classrooms. I am excited to announce that EPSA have kindly agreed to fund the cost of the lockers. We hope to complete the refurbishments and have the lockers set up for after half term. I would like to thank EPSA for agreeing to fund this project and the continued support they give to Eversley for helping to raise money for the school and children.

### **Forest School**

Mrs Turner and the Year 2 children have had fun this week enjoying outdoor learning in the sunshine. I loved the conker necklaces they made. Last year some of the Forest School work took place in the park and also on the school grounds. Mrs Turner has wanted to develop an area within the school ground, including having a log cabin for working in. I would like to thank EPSA again for supporting this project by giving £7,000 to help develop our own Forest School on our school grounds. This is an area of our School Improvement Plan, that we would like to develop outdoor learning across the whole school.

### **Secondary School Transfer**

The office has now resent the correct dates for Secondary School Open Evenings. I would advise all parent/carers in both Years 5&6 to visit. If your child is in Year 5, it is good to find out more about the schools and if they need to sit additional tests. I will hold a meeting for Year 5 parents/carers in the spring term. #### **Sugar Tax**

The Government and Local Authority have given each school a small amount of money from 'Sugar Tax.' We have been given a few suggestions about how we need to spend this money. As a school we will be using this money for developing well-being and providing children with a positive mind. We have decided as a school to use the money to develop a nurture room, which will support children with attachment issues. We hope to also use the money to develop a sensory room and if we have any money left, buy in support from a children counselling service.

#### **Interventions**

We hope to be running spelling, reading and maths interventions in the next two weeks. If your child needs support with spellings, we can recommend the app 'Spelling Bee' or 'Spelling Shed.'



### **ESafety**

On Thursday, Year 6 had ESafety training. Please continue to talk to your child/children about staying safe online. This week's safeguarding information is about Fortnite, as I know many children are playing this game at home.

### **Safeguarding Reminder**

#### What is Fortnite?

Fortnite is an online game, which includes Battle Royale, where players do not have to pay to play. In Battle Royale, 100 players compete against each other to be the last person standing in player vs player (PVP) combat. Users play against people of different ages from across the world, and can talk and interact with each other as they play through the in-game chat feature.

### What age rating is Fortnite?

Fortnite has a PEGI rating of 12, PEGI have said this is due to the: 'frequent scenes of mild violence. It is not suitable for persons under 12 years of age.' This PEGI rating only takes into account the content in the game and not the contact element, where players may be exposed to swearing and offensive language from strangers, either through audio or on-screen text chat.

### What do I need to know?

As Fortnite is an online game, you will play against players of different ages from across the world. Currently it is available on Nintendo Switch, PC, Mac, PlayStation and XBox and Apple products. It is downloadable from the Fortnite website, this download gives access to both the free and paid versions of the game. Our advice is: Do not let your child play the game if under 12 and monitor if you have older children.



Finally, I would like to say a huge thank you to all the volunteers who come and support weekly at Eversley Primary School. I would like to say a special thank you to Betty, who has been volunteering in Year 6 for 18 years! She will be our guest of honour this week at 'Superstars Tea.' I feel she is a superstar to have given so many years to help support the children and staff at Eversley.
