

A young Meth in the Navy

On Wednesday, 14th November, Monty Meth came to Eversley to inspire the students with his intriguing World War 2 story. This amazing man joined the pupils of year 6 in celebrating the 100-year anniversary of the end of WW1.

Meth talked about his wartime story, bravely surviving WW1. "Me and my friends thought that being evacuated was just a laugh- a holiday!" he explained. Monty's interesting childhood has educated all, helping to understand how hard it was in the war and the unfortunate reality of those humbling events.

Armistice day- more known as remembrance day - is the celebration and remembrance of the soldiers who unfortunately had fallen in the war. Meth, who is Betty's loyal husband, informed the Eversley students all about those dreadful years. He also explained

that over 17 million soldiers sadly passed away. Monty Meth had spread smiles across the children's faces, "He was amazing!", a student quoted.

This inspiring man, sang a beautiful song to celebrate his life, 'The White Cliffs of Dover'; a song that captured the essence of Wartime in Britain.
