## Our value of the month is **Cooperation**



Painted by impressionist Camille Pissarro, Hay Harvest at Eragny shows a group of people working together to harvest crops. In a situation like this, **cooperation** is imperative, as without it, the crops would not be harvested, the workers would not be paid and people would go without the crops they so heavily relied on for their daily food.

Pissarro was an impressionist who mainly painted landscapes, focusing on the effects of light on colour. He famously quoted: "Work at the same time on sky, water, branches, ground, keeping everything going on an equal basis...Don't be afraid of putting on colour...Paint generously and unhesitatingly, for it is best not to lose the first impression." ... the essence of impressionism.

Hay Harvest at Eragny helps us to understand how **cooperation** can help us to make light of a heavy workload and to think about how working together can make our work a more enjoyable experience. By encouraging **cooperation**, we hope to help each other, create happier and better relationships and become well rounded citizens.
