Reading	Read your book for 20 minutes every day and then spend 30 mins to complete the reading activities	Read your books and complete your reading record. 1) Choose a book from home that you haven't read before. Highlight any unknown words, any words you cannot pronounce, and then look them up in a dictionary. Write down the meaning of each word. 2) Choose five words most unfamiliar to you and write each of them in a sentence. 3) Write a paragraph and predict what you think might happen next in the story. 4) Write 3 sentences to describe the setting, 5) Write 3 sentences to describe one of the characters. 6) After you have read the book, write a book review to a friend to encourage them to read the book	
Reading comprehension	1/2 hour per day, work through every activity for each text	Log onto your Literacy Planet account and complete the work that has been set for the class.	
Spelling and grammar	2 pieces per week	Log onto your Literacy Planet account and complete the work set for your class.	
English	5 pieces per week	Over the next 2 weeks complete the 10 English activities set on Purple mash	
Times Tables	15 mins daily	Log onto your Times Table Tutor account. Practice the times tables. <u>Additional times table ideas:</u> Log on to Purple Mash	
Mathematics	30 mins per day	Log onto your My Maths account and complete the work set for your class. Log on to MyMaths, click on the 'practice' tab, then 'Y3'. Work through the lessons. Click on the tab, click 'try lesson' which will take you through the strategy your child will need to use to complete the tasks. Once you have gone through the lesson, click on 'start homework' and complete the tasks.	

This work is the equivalent of around 3 - 3 ½ hours work per day.
