

Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you and your families are keeping safe and well.

I wanted to start by saying a huge thank you to all the staff who have worked incredibly hard this term. It has been a very busy time with many new things to organise to ensure that the school is safe for everyone. All staff have gone above and beyond to ensure that the children have stayed in their class bubbles and been kept safe at all times.

EPSA Event – Kids’ Rules Day

A huge thanks to EPSA for organising this event, and a huge thank you to all the parents who contributed. A total of £1323 was raised from this event.

Distance/Online Learning

As a school we recognised that we needed to move to Microsoft Teams in order to provide better education for children if classes have to self-isolate or should we go into lockdown again. Ms Goddard started training the staff in September during our weekly staff meetings and also held twilight sessions to give additional support to staff when needed. This has been a completely new way of working. We created a timeline so that everyone was clear of expectations and to ensure everyone would be fully trained and able to support children effectively at home.

At the start of September, the teachers had prepared two weeks of standalone lessons, to be used if a class went into lockdown or had to self-isolate. When two classes in Year 4 were told to self-isolate the teachers decided that instead of sending this distance learning home, they would continue with the current learning taking place in Year 4. They felt this was really important, as it would ensure that when the children return to school the teaching of a catch up curriculum would not be necessary.

I would like to congratulate the Year 4 teachers who trained themselves further and set up online learning within a few days. They worked additional hours to make sure that they got this right and provided a variety of online, pre-recorded assignments for children to do at home with daily support. Sometimes it is hard for parents to envisage the amount of time and effort that goes into making these changes, so thank you to all the parents who have sent positive emails, thanking the teachers for their effort and support.

Meet the Team Presentations

It is evident from the parent/carer questionnaire that some parents/carers have been disappointed that they have not been informed about what their child is learning this term.

Firstly, I would like to apologise that you are only getting the 'Meet the Team' presentations and core subject coverage on Friday 23rd October.

In school, the first few weeks were incredibly challenging and we needed to make sure our risk assessment was fully in place and that the children were happy and settling back into school well. We also had members of staff test positive for Covid-19, which had a huge impact on staffing as we needed to ensure that we had teachers and support staff in each class bubble to keep classes running. We wanted to do the presentations live on Microsoft Teams, but had not yet had the opportunity to fully train staff, parents and children; we were therefore concerned that not all parents/carers would be able to log on. This week years 1-6 have put together a pre-recorded presentation which will be emailed to parents. Reception, who have recently held their 'Meet the Teacher' meetings, are in the process of recording their curriculum presentation and this will be sent out after half term.

Again, I would like to thank the staff who have adapted to this new way of working. It is incredibly hard to do a pre-recorded presentation and if you are a perfectionist like me, I had to record myself 10 times to get it right!

As a school, we have decided to keep our 10-minute parent consultations which were increased from 5 minutes last year. We have also kept to November as this was something that was largely preferred by parents/carers. Once you have booked your consultation, and after the closing date, you will be able to see the link to join your meeting on your Microsoft Teams calendar. E-Safety- Microsoft Teams

Using Microsoft Teams will be fantastic in allowing all of us to keep in touch should the school go down into lockdown or if classes need to self-isolate. For it to be a safe and positive environment for us all, we are reminding the children of some basic e-safety rules to follow when learning online. The purpose of the Microsoft Teams is to stay in touch with friends in a safe environment. As always, we ask that you are aware of what your child is looking at online and that you are watching as they interact with us or each other. Not only will this be positive for their learning but it will also help to keep them safe.

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Messages on Microsoft Teams

Any messages that are posted on the general section are seen by everyone; this includes staff and pupils of our school. Any messages posted in the class pages are only seen by the class teacher and the pupils of that class. We are asking the children to think before they post and not say anything that they would not say face to face in school and would not mind everybody hearing. Any messages sent that are inappropriate will be dealt with in the same way as they would be in school. I know parents/carers will support the school staff with this.

Concerns on Microsoft Teams

If a child is worried or unhappy about anything they see online, we are asking them to tell their parent/carer. You can then email your child's teacher via the office, who will work to resolve any problems. Likewise, if you have any concerns then please get in touch with the class teacher via email. Please be aware that teachers will only be contactable during normal working hours. Do not allow your child to email the class teacher or to start a chat or video call in the evening. Let's all work together to keep our children safe online.


