School Meals

Please remember to book your child's school lunches. Children can choose to have school dinners, packed lunch or a combination of both.

It is the parent's responsibility to book meals via their ParentPay account.



Please ensure your ParentPay account is in credit to enable your child to have a school meal. Any meal bookings must be confirmed and paid for within 2 hours of selecting the booking. Failure to do so will result in the booking being automatically cancelled.

Please also ensure you select both a main meal and dessert before you confirm your booking otherwise it will not be accepted.

If your child has not booked a meal, then they are expected to bring in a home packed lunch. The school is unable to book or cancel meals, therefore, if you want to make changes to your booked meals, these may be done in advance. No changes can be made on the day.
