Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you are all well and keeping safe.

Today I have sent you an important email about what you need to do if you or your child has Covid symptoms. It is important that we are all following the advice from Public Health England, so that we can protect our community.

### **School Street**

This week I have spoken to Alex Kidd (Safe and Sustainable Travel Officer for Enfield) in regards to us achieving School Streets. We want to make the road around the Crescent car free and this scheme will prevent cars going up to the school gates at drop off and pick up times. We have been informed that unless we achieve the School Travel Plan award and the council get additional funding, then we will not be able to apply for this scheme.

Alex explained that we need to focus on families using different ways to travel to school, and to avoid coming to school by car. Our catchment area for Eversley last year only went as far as 0.4, which is less than half a mile. Therefore, all of our families should be able to walk to school. This week the children have carried out a 'Hands-Up' survey to show how they travel to and from school. The teachers have asked them how they are currently travelling to school and how they would prefer to travel to school e.g. bike, scooter, walk or public transport. We can already see that lots of children would prefer to cycle to school. We do have bike sheds for children to leave their bike safely at school, so maybe this is something you would like to try.

### **Thank You!**

I wanted to thank Ms Lauder and all the House Captains for organising the donations of food and other household items for our local foodbank. Thank you to all parents/carers who have kindly donated. We have extended this for another 3 days, so if you haven't donated yet and would like to, then you have until Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> December at 3.30pm. I am sure Ms Lauder will share a photograph to show how generous our families have been.

### **Safeguarding Online**

I know that some children may get new technology devices for Christmas presents and I want to remind you of key points that you should go through with your child. Even though we discuss these at school and you probably talk to your child about these at home, sometimes children still aren't safe. An example of this is when I spoke to my own child about someone who they were playing and talking with online, but they didn't actually know them. When I asked my son who it was he said 'My

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friend John knows them, so they must be okay.’ It actually turned out that John knew the person through another friend. I explained that is when it can get dangerous, as nobody really knew who the person was. Please talk through the points with your child.

### **Staying Safe Online**

- 1) Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number.**
- 2) Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online most people can see it and may be able to download it - it's not just yours anymore**
- 3) Keep your privacy settings as high as possible**
- 4) Never give out your passwords**
- 5) Don't befriend people you don't know**
- 6) Don't meet up with people you've met online. Speak to your parent or carer about people suggesting you do**
- 7) Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are**
- 8) Think carefully about what you say before you post something online**
- 9) Respect other people's views, even if you don't agree with someone else's views doesn't mean you need to be rude**
- 10) If you see something online that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or worried: leave the website, turn off your computer if you want to and tell a trusted adult immediately**
