Your child will be given the time of their lesson and it will be displayed in their classroom, music room and the office. Could you please talk to your child about arriving for their lesson at the right time with their instrument and their music. They will benefit from having the full lesson as lessons cannot be extended if they turn up late. Your child will also need a yellow practice book - there are plenty in the music rooms to use. These books are your communication with your child's tutor, and for the tutor to inform you how practice is going. If your child will not be in school on day of their music lesson, please inform your tutor/EMS as soon as possible so that alternative plans can be made.

If your child is learning to play the piano or keyboard, they will benefit from having their own one at home to practise. Recorders and guitars can be purchased from music shops and all other instruments can be hired from EMS or other music shops. Apart from piano and keyboard, your child will need to bring into school their own instrument and music each week.

Most missed lessons can be rescheduled for the last week of this term provided sufficient notice is given, but not for illness and trips/events without prior notice. It is the parents responsibility to inform the tutor/EMS if their child is going to be absent from a lesson.

We hope your child has a happy term learning their instrument!

Role model of the week



This week's role model of the week is Emma Raducanu.

Back in July, 18 year old tennis player, Emma Raducanu from London competed at Wimbledon. Being ranked 333rd in the world, she wasn't expected to get very far in the tournament. However, she made it to the final 16. During the match, Emma suffered breathing difficulties

and had to withdraw. She said "I was playing the best tennis of my life in front of an amazing crowd this week and I think the whole experience caught up with me."

Just two months later, Emma was back at the US Open showing amazing determination, skill and resilience. She fought her way through all of the rounds without losing a single set and made it to

the final. In an amazing display of talent, confidence and mental strength, Emma won the US open making her the first British female to win there since 1968. Furthermore, she is the youngest Briton to ever win one of the four major tennis tournaments.

Throughout the tournament, Emma appeared to be full of joy and embracing every second of her experience. Emma teaches us not only that confidence and self-belief is so important, but also that if you really love doing something and work hard enough, you can succeed and achieve greatness.


