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Role model of the week

This week's role model of the week is Dr. Hayat Sindi.

Dr. Hayat Sindi is a medical scientist, born in Mecca, Saudi Arabia in 1967. In 1991, she convinced her family to allow her to travel alone to the UK in order to pursue her higher education. After a year spent learning English and studying for her A-levels, she was accepted at King's College London, where she graduated with a degree in pharmacology in 1995. While at King's College she was a recipient of Princess Anne's Award for her undergraduate work on allergy.



While at university, Dr. Hayat was pressured to abandon her religious and cultural beliefs. She resisted this pressure, holding the view that a person's religion, colour or gender has no bearing on scientific contributions. Dr. Hayat went on to get a Ph.D. in biotechnology from Newnham College, Cambridge in 2001. She was the first woman from any of the Arab States of the Persian Gulf to complete a doctoral degree in the field of biotechnology.

In 2010, Dr. Hayat was the winner of the Mekkah Al Mukaramah prize for scientific innovation. She was also named a 2011 Emerging Explorer by the National Geographic Society. In January 2013, she again broke new ground by becoming part of the first group of women to serve in Saudi Arabia's Consultative Council (the group of people who advise the King of Saudi Arabia on matters that are important to the country).

Dr. Hayat Sindi reminds us that our gender, nationality, race or religion should never stand in the way of us reaching our goals.

- Please do not drive your vehicle whilst using a mobile phone

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
PSHE Book Recommendations

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Appreciating Music

Music can have a profound effect on how you are feeling and how much energy you have; just watch anything on television and before long there is music. Music with energy, anticipating an event, calming or joyful, every type of music is available for you to hear. At school children listen to music in their music lessons and they use that music to inspire their own music making. We are now going to start listening to music on a Friday morning; the whole school will be listening to two pieces of music each month, so each piece of music will be heard more than once. The children will spend some time discussing what they have heard or seen with their class teachers.

Music in November will have a seasonal theme with 'Autumn' by Vivaldi which is played by instruments with strings and Mussorsky 'Night on a Bare Mountain,' played by an orchestra. We will be spotting the different instruments and thinking how the instruments can be grouped as to how they are played. We will talk about imagining what could be happening while this music is being played; for example a starry night, leaves blowing, icy water and the something unexpected!

I hope that the children enjoy their musical listening experiences.
