1539	Elsyng Palace passed into Henry VIII's ownership	<p>Forty Hall is set in its own estate, Grade 1 listed and important to architectural English history. Built by former Lord Mayor of London, Sir Nicholas Rainton in 1632. Within the Forty Hall Estate, you will find The Elysng Palace which was the childhood home of King Edward VI and Queen Elizabeth I.
