Key Knowledge

Learning about religion

Hindus believe that there is one supreme god (Brahman) too vast to see. God is in everything in living things and in us and always with you. Each of the supreme God's qualities is shown in the form of one of the many Gods. For example

- Brahma – God of creation
- Vishnu – God of protection of the universe
- Shiva – God of destruction
- Ganesha – God of new beginnings and the remover of obstacles
- Saraswati – Goddess of knowledge and arts
- Lakshmi – Goddess of wealth and purity
- Shakti – Goddess of energy, power and creativity

When Hindu's pray at home, they are welcoming a God in. They set up a shrine to the God.

- make connections between the belief that God is in everyone and everything and the implications for how Hindus should live their lives.
- make connections between the themes of Hindu narratives about the gods and the parallel experiences for humans trying to live a good life.

Prior learning

- In Year 1, children will have been given a brief overview of the Hindu religion and Krishna.
- In Years 2 and 3, children will have learnt the story of Rama and Sita, how Diwali/Divali reflects this story and how it is celebrated.
