- land use, economic activity including trade links, and the distribution of natural resources including energy, food, minerals and water.

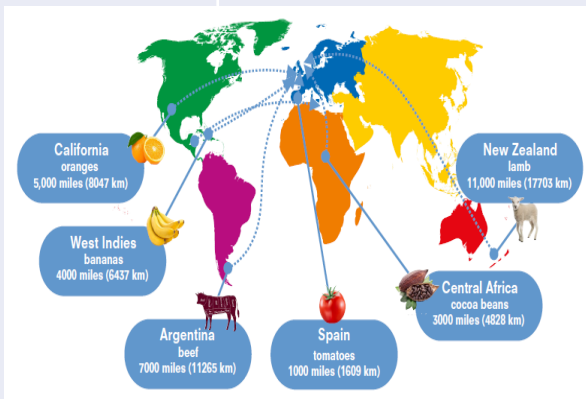
Key Knowledge

What is trade between countries so important?

- Not all countries have suitable weather conditions to grow food so they trade/import from other countries.
- Different climates allow different food to be grown.
- Countries can earn lots of money by exporting food to other countries.

What are natural resources?

Natural resources are all the resources which exist naturally and can be used by people.
Water, oil, forests, rocks, minerals, soils , animals (food)

What is the problem with using the natural resource 'oil'?

- It is non-renewable
- Burning oil produces carbon dioxide but carbon dioxide is a greenhouse gas which causes global warming
- Burning oil pollutes the air
- Oil is expensive to import
