Asking and giving the price of food at the market.	C'est combien ? How much is it? C'est deux euros cinquante-trois. It's two euros fifty-three.

Key Grammar

un / une / des	un and une mean <u>a</u> or <u>an</u> . When talking about fruit and vegetables in the plural we use des for <u>some</u> . des oignons = some onions
Numbers to 100	Multiples of 10 to 100 10 – dix 20 – vingt 30 – trente 40 – quarante 50 – cinquante 60 – soixante 70 – soixante-dix 80 – quatre-vingt 90 – quatre-vingt-dix 100 – cent The pattern is: vingt-et-un vingt-deux vingt-trois etc to 69 70-79 we add 'teens'. 70 – soixante-dix 71 – soixante-onze 72 – soixante-douze etc 80 – 99 we add 1-19 e.g. 81 – quatre-vingt-un 88 – quatre-vingt-huit 95 – quatre-vingt-quinze
