Key vocabulary

Spelling	Definition
HTML	This stands for Hypertext Markup Language . It is a code used to define what a website will look like.
Copyright	It is easy to copy, change, or download content from the internet. Copyright law protects the control you have over the things that you create. It also protects the work of others.
Content	Content can be any creative element e.g. text, applications, images, archived e-mail messages, data, e-services, audio and video files that you might use for your webpage .
Webpage	A webpage is part of a website .
Hyperlink	Text or media that when clicked, takes the user to another specified location (URL)
