Netball Cluster League Fixtures

Throughout the school year, local schools have met to play netball in our 'cluster league'. Across 3 dates (October, February and April), the following have met at Eversley or Merryhills to face each of the competing schools: St Monica's, Grange Park Prep (GPP), St. Michael-at-Bowes (SMAB), Oakthorpe, Merryhills and Eversley

On Monday 24th April, Eversley faced their final two opponents in the local cluster league - SMAB and Merryhills. Each match consisted of two 8-minute halves, with a quick drinks break before swapping shooting ends and returning to play.

First up, we played against SMAB.

Despite SMAB having the first centre pass of the game, Eversley went out fighting. They soon gained back possession and looked really strong on court. Throughout the first 8 minutes Eversley were in control. Kira coolly took the opportunity to score our first goal of the match, which spurred everyone on further. Esmee and Kira alternated their goal scoring responsibilities throughout the 1st half, scoring two goals a piece, meaning we went into the half time break at 4-0 up.

The first game finished with a 4-0 victory to Eversley.

Next, our final game of the cluster league was against Merryhills. Alex stepped into the Centre position to take over from Amelia. Both girls did a fantastic job covering the full court and switching constantly between attacking and defending and adapting to the team's needs.

Again, Kira and Esmee shared the daunting task of shooting and by the end of the first half Eversley were 5-2 up. Our 5 goals would not have been possible without Havin's persistence in Wing Attack to feed the ball into the attacking circle ready for the shooters to score. She positioned herself brilliantly around the circle edge to provide support to our two shooters.

In the second half, whilst Merryhills scored another goal, we scored a further 3 meaning the final score was a well-earned 8-3 to Eversley. Merryhills kindly voted a 'Player of the Match' which went to Orla - very well deserved, well done!
