Key Vocabulary

Thinking voice	When you think a rhythm or phrase in your head and no sound is made	

Statutory Requirement

Key stage 1

Key Skills

- Sing a variety of songs showing increasing accuracy of pitch, dynamics and length
- Explore playing sounds from a score in 4 time
- Perform from graphics/symbols a piece of music
- Compose and perform a sequence of sounds on a score
