Key Knowledge

Racism is when people are treated unfairly because of their skin colour or background. It is a kind of discrimination

Prejudice	an unfair and unreasonable opinion or feeling formed without enough thought or knowledge
Equality	where people are treated fairly and given equal chances without any discrimination
Justice	a concept on ethics and law that means that people behave in a way that is fair, equal and balanced for everyone.
