Pupils should be taught to:

use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes play tuned and untuned instruments musically listen with concentration and understanding to a range of high-quality live and recorded music experiment with, create, select and combine sounds using the inter-related dimensions of music.

Key Skills

Pupils will be taught to:

- Speak and chant together
- Sing songs showing increasing vocal control
- · Sing songs in different styles with enjoyment
- Co-ordinate actions to a pulse, to go with songs
- Sing in time to a steady beat
- Use graphics/ symbols to portray the sounds they have chosen
- Compose a sequence of sounds without help and perform
- Recognise different percussion sounds
- Follow hand signals to start/stop/ play loud/ quiet
