Key Knowledge

Money

- Money is used to pay for things.
- Many people get their money from working at a job.
- There are many different jobs for people to do.
- When people have jobs, they get paid money – this is called wages.
- When we have money there are certain things we need to pay for such as food, housing and energy. If we have any money left over, we can choose to spend it or save it.
- We can pay in many different ways such as coins, banknotes, bank cards, contactless and online transfers.
- The method we choose to pay with often depends on what it is we are buying.
- There are also different ways to store our money such as a piggy bank, a wallet/purse or by putting it in a bank.
- Where we choose to keep money depends on how much there is.

The world around us

- A lot of things we use contain plastic. This plastic is often only used once and then thrown out.
- Some of this plastic ends up in our rivers and oceans and this can cause problems for wildlife.
- To help stop this, people should try and recycle or reuse their plastic as much as possible.
- Bees are very important for the environment as they help to pollinate plants. This helps plants to grow and produce food.
- There are over 25,000 different species of bees and the different types like to live in different places.
- It is very important to be safe when crossing the road.
- Before you cross, you should STOP, LOOK, LISTEN and THINK
- Where possible, you should use a pedestrian crossing.
