Key Knowledge

Money	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Different people have different wants, needs and priorities. They may decide what to spend their money on depending on what they enjoy doing, any special occasions coming up, what mood they are in etc. • Sometimes people make spending decisions based on the impact on the environment – e.g. buying things that are only produced locally, items with less packaging, Fairtrade etc. • What matters is that people do what is right for them, their family and their wellbeing. • However we decide to spend out money, it is important we keep track so that we know how much money we have. • Advertisements often persuade us to spend money on certain products. They are there to convince us to buy things either by making them look fantastic or by using special offers.
The world around us	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some homes around the world are very different to our own. • Regardless of what a house looks like, for it to be considered a home, people should be safe, comfortable and have a sense a belonging. • The UK is a democratic country. This means we, as people, have a say in the running of the country. We can elect our own representatives. The people in positions of power are there because of a vote and they cannot make decisions without consulting other Members of Parliament (MPs) • Parliament is made up from people from all different political parties so one group cannot make all of the decisions and rules.
