Remembrance Day - Poppy Sale

Whole School Assembly

The big question today was 'Are there some jobs that robots could never do?'

The children learnt that Amazon have created a new robot, which has human-like features and is being taught to pick up and move empty boxes. The children looked at some of the images below and discussed what are the benefits of a robot carrying out a job rather than a person.



The children were able to link today's assembly to the following British Values:

Mutual Respect and Tolerance - Life is not the same for everyone and we can show respect for beliefs others have and the choices they make.



Individual Liberty - It is up to an individual to decide if they would prefer to purchase a robot to do their hoovering or other jobs, rather than doing it themselves.

Ibrahim in Year 6 felt robots could save people time, which could mean they relax more.

Today's assembly linked to the United Nation Rights of a Child - Article 32- Protection from harmful work.

I reminded all children that they have a right to be protected from doing work that is dangerous or bad for their education, health or development. We reflected on today's assembly that there are some jobs robots could do instead of humans.
