



Rising to Reception

'Rising to Reception' is a programme aimed at the families of children with communication difficulties who



are due to start primary school in September 2024 (i.e. born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020).

The Enfield Communication Advisory Support Service (ECASS) service and partners will be running the series of **Rising to Reception** sessions throughout the year to help prepare your child for starting school.



National updates from Contact

A <u>review of the law on disabled children's social care in England</u> has been commenced by the Law Commission on the request of the Department for Education.

Currently, a patchwork of legislation governs disabled children's social care law, some of which dates back more than five decades. This has contributed to a variation in the amount and quality of support local authorities provide.

The overarching aim of the review will be to simplify and strengthen the law, ensuring that the system is fair and works for children, parents and local authorities.

The Law Commission has started preliminary work, with the aim of publishing a consultation in Spring 2024. To inform this process, in the coming months the Commission is engaging with a range of individuals and charities, like Contact, with experience of social care for disabled children

In particular, the Commission hopes to engage with parent carers through a combination of online discussion sessions and surveys to better understand the current barriers to accessing social care. Read <u>more about social care across the UK on Contact's website</u>.
