really did make it an extra special lunchtime. The children asked if we could do it every day!


#### **EPSA Christmas Bingo**

#### **Sustainability Assembly**

Thank you to some of the Environment Cabinet, Prime Minister and Deputy Prime Minister who delivered an assembly today about sustainability. As a school we will be thinking about how we can be more sustainable with water. The Environment Cabinet have come up with some ideas below:

- Turn off the water in the taps when you are not using them
- Only pour the amount of water you want to drink
- Collect the rain water in water butts to water the plants
- Check that taps aren't dripping and are turned off
- Use the water in the jugs that is left over at lunchtime to water the plants or fill the pond

#### Norovirus

Norovirus cases are increasing across the borough as the temperature drops. Norovirus causes <u>diarrhoea</u> and <u>vomiting</u> and is one of the most common stomach bugs in the UK. Please see the information below, which we would like you to discuss with your child/children.

- stay off school if you catch it, for at least 48 hours after the norovirus symptoms have stopped
- avoid visiting anyone in hospital during this time
- wash your hands frequently and thoroughly with soap and water, particularly after using the toilet and before preparing or handling food
- be aware that alcohol-based hand gels don't kill the virus

Dear Parent/Carer,

The school has been given the opportunity to take part in a project that will run jointly between schools and the Metropolitan Police Service. This project is known as Operation Encompass.

Operation Encompass is the notification to schools that a child (under 18) has been exposed to, or involved in, any domestic incident. This will ordinarily be done by the start of the next school day.

Operation Encompass will ensure that a specially trained member of the school staff, known as a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL), is informed. The DSL can then use the information that has been shared, in confidence, to ensure the wellbeing of the child.

The school may be able to make provisions or adjustments to assist the child and their family.

We are keen to offer the best support possible to all our pupils and we believe this will be extremely beneficial for all those involved.
