Others felt that they would want to drive the car themselves, as they would feel nervous.

The children learnt that Mark Harper believes that fully autonomous vehicles will be gradually rolled out by 2026.

The children were able to link today's assembly to 'Rule of Law' as everyone who drives a vehicle has to follow laws to help keep everyone safe. These laws may change in the future.

Today's assembly was linked to the UN Right Article 3 - Best interest of the child. The children learnt that all adults should do what is best for children, which may affect how and when we use driverless vehicles in the future.
