Year 5 trip to Bayfordbury Observatory

On Tuesday 23rd January, all of year 5 went on a trip to Bayfordbury Observatory. First, we had a big interactive talk about all different space topics including Super Earth, nebulae and galaxies. We got to ask questions and they answered them but they didn't know everything yet – they are still finding out so much more! They also explained a lot about how stars are formed and why they explode. We were shown lots of pictures of things taken through telescopes.

Next, we looked at the oldest and newest telescopes at the observatory. We found out that the oldest telescope had mini telescopes attached to it. But the newest one was much higher and fully automated. The newest one was made two years ago and the oldest one is over fifty years old.

After that, we were taken into a huge bubble-like planetarium which show all the planets, as well as stars, nebulae and galaxies above our heads. They also explained how fast each planet spun and what Saturn's rings are made out of. They showed us the moon's different sized craters and the mass of the sun. Fun fact - you could fit over 1000 Jupiters in the sun!

Overall, year 5 had a great time.
