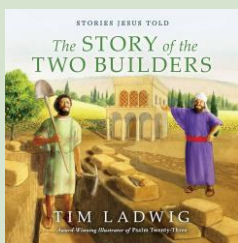
Other stories such as the parable of the two builders, show Jesus as a teacher. This particular story depicts Jesus as the foundations upon which Christians build their lives.

A book in the Bible (Galatians) states: 'The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.' These are the qualities many Christians strive for today.

Christians don't believe they are perfect. Many Christians admit their wrongs and say sorry to God regularly. Christians ask God to help them follow Jesus' example. Many Christians say this is the main way they can try to live with love, gentleness or kindness.

## Enfield SACRE Statutory requirements

Spelling	Definition
Inspiration	Something that makes someone want to do something or that gives someone an idea about what to do or create.
Miracle	Acts that involve things that don't usually happen naturally – they need God's involvement.
Incarnation	Taking something not physical and making it physical.
Prophet	One who speaks on behalf of a god or who is divinely inspired to reveal the will of a God.
Anointed	The person or people chosen or declared chosen by God.
Qualities	A distinctive characteristic possessed by someone or something.
