## Glue Batik



Paint the design onto fabric with PVA glue. Allow it to dry completely.


Use acrylic paints to add colour and patterns, Cover the entire piece of fabric painting over and around the dry glue. Allow to dry.


Wash out the glue.
AS it dissolves it will feel slimy. Keep going until you can't feel any more glue. Lay your fabric flat to dry..
