architecture	Designing buildings
architect	A person who designs buildings
composition	Putting different elements together in a pleasing way
elevation	In architecture this refers to the angle that a building is being viewed from
legacy	Something lasting to remember a person or event for future generations
monoprint	Printmaking where only one impression can be made
perspective	The angle from which you are looking at something
proportion	How big on element of an artwork appears to be compared to the whole thing
transform	To change how something looks

<p>Shape: Shapes can be used to place the key elements in a composition</p> <p>Line: Lines can be used by artists to control what the viewer looks like within a composition e.g. by using diagonal lines to draw your eye into the centre of a drawing</p>

Friedensreich Hundertwasser (1928-2000)
Austrian artist and architect
 Most famous for his imaginative, colourful and whimsical architectural work. The Hundertwasser house in Austria is one of his most famous buildings.





Zaha Hadid (1950-2016)
Born in Baghdad, Iraq
 First woman to be awarded the Pritzker Architecture Prize in 2004. Her futuristic designs use strong materials like steel and concrete but her buildings are soft and curved.





How to make a monoprint




Ink a flat surface



Lay paper over the ink



Draw your design on the paper pressing firmly



Peel the paper from the print to reveal your print
