Year 5 Trip to Nanak Darbar Gurdwara - Turesday 23rd March 2024

When we arrived at the Gurdwara, we had to take our shoes off and they gave us head coverings if we hadn't brought our own ones. After that, we washed our hands if they were dirty.

Then, we entered the large prayer room where we were told to sit down quietly. There was a screen with a slide show on it. The slide show was all about the Sikh religion and all of the Gurus. It also told us about lots of the important Gurdwaras like the Golden Temple in India. There was also a man sitting on a stage reading the Guru Granth Sahib which is the holy book.

After the slide show they took us to see the Guru Granth Sahib (the 11th Guru) and we went into the kitchen where they served orange juice and biscuits. The kitchen is called the Langar and in it they serve free food to anyone from any religion.

At the end, we left the Gurdwara and started the journey back to school.

During the trip, we also learnt the 5K's of Sikhism which are Kes (hair), Kara (bracelet), Kangha (comb), Kacchera (shorts) and Kirpan (dagger). We also learnt that the 1st Gurdwara was built by Guru Nanak the 1st Guru.
